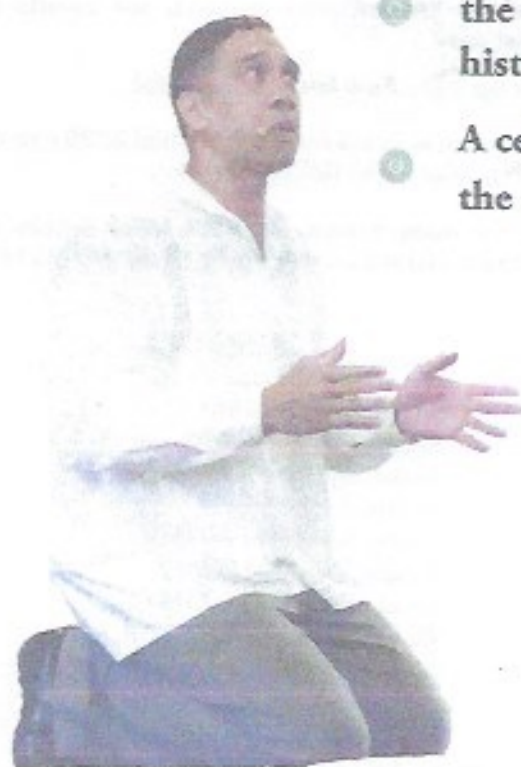

The bicentennial of the departure and arrival of the ABCFM missionaries to Hawaii happens in the Fall of 2019. Henry 'Ōpūkaha'ia, the young Hawaiian who inspired the ABCFM mission, died on February 17, 1818, in Cornwall, CT. The Thaddeus sailed on October 23, 1819. 'Opūkaha'ia: The Inspiration for the Hawaiian Mission

'Opūkaha'ia, a young Hawaiian who came to the U.S. in 1808, was being groomed to be a key figure in a mission to Hawai'i. He went on a promotional speaking tour of New England. Unfortunately, 'Opūkaha'ia died unexpectedly at Cornwall on February 17, 1818. His memoir became a best selling book that helped to fund the Mission.

The Pioneer Company

The life and memoirs of 'Opūkaha'ia inspired missionaries to volunteer to carry his message. On October 23, 1819, the Pioneer Company of missionaries from the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions (ABCFM) from the northeast United States, set sail on the Thaddeus for the Hawaiian Islands. They first sighted and arrived at Kawaihae on March 30, 1820, and finally anchored at Kailua-Kona, April 4, 1820.

Missionary Period

Over the course of 43 years (1820-1863, the "Missionary Period"), about 184 men and women in twelve Companies served in Hawai'i to carry out the mission of the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions (ABCFM) in the Hawaiian Islands.
